ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

An entirely unexpected tragedy in the form of an overdose of copper by an overseas breeder resulted in the loss of a number of prized Miniature Hereford heifers. It was supposed to be a routine supplement but somehow the copper levels had changed in the pasture which affected what the animals were able to absorb safely. This breeder has urged others to check first whether or not any additives are required before supplying them. The same goes, particularly in New Zealand, for selenium. Not all parts of the country are selenium deficient and if using supplements check their contents first as it is very easy to overdose.

TECHNICAL TIPS

Checking for Inbreeding Percentages

With breeders keen to have their breeding cows serviced by a compatible bull the new service available on the NZHA website is great and simple to use. All you need is the registration number of your cow and that of a bull you are thinking of using. Go onto the NZHA website and click on **Mating Predictor** which is on the red line. A system will come up where you enter the registrations of the sire and dam then hit **Search**. The resulting details will have a section at the bottom on the left hand side which shows the **Inbreeding Coefficienct Percentage**. The ideal percentages are below 20% as that means any relationship between the two animals is more distant. Looking at this simplified example the first combination is not closely related while the second combination is son and mother:
